HANGOUT (warming up to the topic):

- 1. During COVID, we've all been forced to keep physical distance, wear masks, and repeatedly wash our hands. How has our focus on staying well by avoiding "contamination" affected you? How do you think it is affecting our culture?
- 2. In what ways are the Old Testament purity laws like the current mask and social distancing mandates? (For examples of Old Testament purity laws see Leviticus 15:19-21; Leviticus 11:24, and Numbers 9:11)

HEAR (listening to God through Scripture):

- 3. Read Mark 5:21-24a.
- Would you call Jairus an insider or outsider? Why?
- What, specifically, does Jairus ask Jesus to do? What effect does Jairus believe that action will have?
- What does Jairus's request tell you about what Jairus believed about Jesus?

- 4. Read Mark 5:24b-34.
- Based on this encounter, do you think this woman was an insider or an outsider? Why?
- What was the disciples' response when Jesus asked who had touched Him? Why was this a logical response?
- Read Leviticus 15:19-27. Based on these verses, why was the woman trying to remain anonymous? What might she have thought when Jesus asked, "Who touched me?"
- Why might this woman and the crowd have been shocked by Jesus' response to the woman?
- How does this story demonstrate that Jesus "reverses the polarity" of sin, shame, and brokenness?

5. Read Mark 5:35-43.

- What happened to Jairus's daughter "in the meantime"? How might Jairus have felt about Jesus' delay along the way?
- What did Jesus do when He was in the room with the child?
- Read Numbers 19:11. Based on this verse, what should have happened as a result of Jesus touching the dead child? What happened instead? Could Jesus have healed the child without touching her? (see John 11:43-44) What does this tell you about Jesus?

6. How do these stories about Jesus relate to your experience with Him? What do these stories mean for people who follow Jesus?

HUDDLE (making it personal and praying together - in huddles):

7. How has Jesus touched the disgusting parts of you? Talk about it, invite accountability and pray together.
